POLICY RECEIVING AND ACTING ON OVERTURES TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY Adopted March 28, 2006

- 1. Proposed overtures for Presbyters' consideration may come from the following:
 - a. any session of a member congregation
 - b. any committee or council of the Presbytery
 - c. any two or more presbyters, ministers and/or elder commissioners
- 2. Proposed overtures shall be submitted to the Stated Clerk in sufficient time to be included in the Presbytery mailing for the assembly at which it is to be considered.
- 3. Proposed overtures shall come before the Presbytery in sufficient time to meet the General Assembly's deadlines, usually 120 days prior to G.A. for those recommending amendments to the *Book of Order* and 45 days for all others.
- 4. Proposed overtures should be written in the format required by the General Assembly.
- 5. Sessions may appoint an Overture Advocate, who need not be an elder commissioner, to speak to the proposed overture.
- 6. Any of the parties identified in #1 above may also request the Presbytery to endorse an overture already submitted to the General Assembly by another Presbytery, providing the Stated Clerk receives the request and a copy of the overture in sufficient time to be included in the Presbytery mailing for the assembly at which such an endorsement is to be considered.
- 7. Parties are encouraged to consult with the Presbytery Stated Clerk for assistance with timing, formatting, presentation and any other related matters.
