Planning

Tell us about the adequacy of your building—accessibility, security, program, etc.

What message does your building convey to the community? What's the future of your building?

Budaet

What's your philosophy of budget for your church? What are the sources of stress and/or joy around budget? What long-term budget plans do you have?

Questions for the pastor

Health, personal and family

How do you balance work, family, etc. to avoid burnout? How do you define and maintain boundaries?

Growth, study leave, vacation

How have you used your study leave? Vacation time? How does your congregation support your study leave? How do you determine how to use study time? Are involved in a support group?

Financial

Is compensation adequate to your needs?
How are terms of call presented to and interpreted to/by the congregation?

Do you take advantage of clergy tax credits, financial planning, etc.?

Relationship with church, concerns, rewards

Explain how your leadership style—strengths and weaknesses—match with your congregation.

What leadership style does session have?

Relationship with Presbytery

What connections do you have with your colleagues?

How are you living out being a presbyter?

In what ways, if any, has Presbytery been involved with your congregation?

Where do you serve at Presbytery?

How do you support Denver Presbytery staff?

What message do you want to give COM?
